Qualifications, License, and Insurance

WHEN YOU BEGIN YOUR SEARCH, START WITH THE BASICS

Make sure every contractor you're evaluating is a fully licensed business that carries valid insurance. These things provide a level of legal and financial protection in the unlikely event that something goes wrong during your roofing project.

Contractor qualifications are also essential to review. Not all roofing contractors invest in training and certifying their crews. Correctly installing a modern roof system can be highly technical. Those contractors who have not been trained in how to install products correctly are likely to make mistakes. Look for a contractor that offers formal inspection services. These contractors are more knowledgeable about what it takes to get the job done right.

Ask for References

Part of doing your due diligence is to ask prospective roofing contractors for references from their prior customers. Reputable roofing contractors will be more than willing to put you in contact with some of their customers. If they are doing their job well, contractors know that you are more likely to hire them after talking with their references.

The real value here is two-fold: First, you'll learn whether the contractor is comfortable enough with their work quality to refer their customers to you for a conversation. Second, you'll be able to ask questions from a third party that is not directly involved with your own roofing project.

Avoid Storm Chasers

Storm chasers are contractors from anywhere but Minnesota who come to 'help' with the recovery effort. While their support may be needed, their work is often done too quickly, and in a few years it begins to fail.

As a result, they come into town to make a quick buck on the job and then leave – never to be seen again until the next disaster strikes.

And since a storm chaser's work is notoriously hasty and poor, it's best to keep them off your roof.

As mentioned before, it's best to hire a local company that knows the climate conditions and materials that work well in your area. In the event of weather incidents that require the involvement of home insurance, All Metro CSI can provide local support in handling your insurance claims.

Experience With Your Project Type and Materials

If your roofing project is more technical in nature than other rooftops, it's a good idea to ask contractors about their experience dealing with your specific roof type. Their answer will provide insights into how the contractor would approach your rooftop and what advantages they might bring to the job. Even if your roof is standard, the materials you intend to use may require a level of expertise that not every roofing company will have, which makes it even more important to ask about contractor experience.



A further point to consider is whether or not a roofing contractor is familiar with the local building codes in your area. The last thing you want to encounter is a needless violation of code because the contractor you hired isn't informed of those critical details. Take time to talk through these details with the contractors you interview.

The best roofing contractors will work with a homeowner to create a written agreement for services. This document helps both parties to understand the specifics of the job before starting. Writing down these details in a legally binding contract protects both homeowner and contractor. Make sure the contractor you hire is willing to sign a written contract with all details and payments clearly spelled out.



Pro Tip:

Some roofing contractors won't obtain the needed permits to do the job. They ask the customer to handle that separately! But navigating the permit process can be time-consuming, especially for those who don't know the process.
